PRESIDENT: The Scofield amendment is adopted. Anything further, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Dierks would move to amend.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dierks, please.

CLERK: Senator, I have AM1265 in front of me.

SENATOR DIERKS: Mr. President and members of the body, I'm going to talk about this just for a moment and then I'm going to withdraw it. But I'm having a whole lot of problems with what's going on here this afternoon. I'm reminded of that statement about lemmings to the sea. You seem to be following a pattern in this body today and it doesn't matter what comes up, we have had some amendments here that were valid, some amendments that should have been adopted, some amendments that came a little bit close, some that didn't even come close.
