state. So after 1992 they don't have to remit these funds anymore?

SENATOR LAMB: Excuse me, Senator, I didn't hear.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: After...after...with the language you insert there it says to me that after 1992 they won't...will not have to provide these funds anymore. Is that correct?

SENATOR LAMB: This is assuming that the committees will be out of existence by that time and that the...the facility will be in operation there. And, as I understand it, those committees then go out of existence and so this is supposedly going to give them plenty of time through 1992 to finish up their work.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay, but then we don't have to have the facility operating until 1993, so if we...if something should come up and we wouldn't make that deadline, we would go...if say we wouldn't get it built right till 1993 then they would go a year without the funding? They have to have it built by '93 and operational? I...I just have a hard time comprehending this. I guess if it is really bad, we can always change it later. I think your intentions are good, Senator, and I will guess if no one else can find a problem with this, I will certainly support you on it.

PRESIDENT: Were you through, Senator Morrissey?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Okay, thank you. Senator Scofield, followed by Senator Withem.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Thank you, Mr. President. I have had a chance to go through these amendments and read them and get them marked up now and I know better now what I'm reading. And this simply takes care of not only the current fiscal year but then would reappropriate the funds into the next year, to appropriate, to give those communities the money now and reappropriate it is fine. I think it's okay and it does what would be the intent of everybody involved here. So I would urge that you adopt the amendment. Thank you.

FRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Withem, please.
