SENATOR MORRISSEY: Sure. Your first amendment, page 6, line 17, strike "onsite" and insert "site". You said E & R brought this to you?

SENATOR WEIHING: Yes, yes, that's right.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: To me, that makes a difference, I don't know, I think it's more substantive than maybe...the expert who shall...

SENATOR WEIHING: Well, if you wish to discuss it with them, well, that's fine.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Pardon?

SENATOR WEIHING: If you wish to discuss it with them, that's fine.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yeah, I just wonder why they couldn't wait till E & R Review but the expert who shall participate in a developer's onsite characterization and selection process. So the intent is not to take any power away from the local monitoring committees to go onsite and review these...watch these people perform the process.

SENATOR WEIHING: It's really to assist them to be able to do that and do it with accredibility and assisting them. I look upon them as being able to assist them and under...and knowing what is being done and the analysis of that to help them with this area. Technologically, you know...

SENATOR MORRISSEY: All right.

SENATOR WEIHING: ...technologically understanding this.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes. Okay, and then the other one is just a tad bit confusing, Senator. Page 7, strike beginning with "committee" on line 6, I don't find committee on line 6. Does it refer to the committee just prior to that, Senator?

SENATOR WEIHING: Actually, that committee is line 5. You just go up to line 5...

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay.
