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contractor. But these are...are...have logs. As they are drilled, there is a log and there are the corers and all of that will be available. So it's simply not a duplication, exact duplication onsite.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay, thank you, Senator. I guess I just can't really vote for this since I've just seen it and it's slightly confusing and it would take it's...take time to make sure that I have no problems with it so I will probably just simply refrain from voting. Thank you.

SENATOR WEIHING: Uh-huh.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Langford, please, followed by Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR LANGFORD: I will yield my time to Senator Kristensen.

PRESIDENT: Okay, thank you. Senator Kristensen, please.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Senator Weihing, real quickly, and my time is up next and I'm going to call the question right after I'm done. So...

PRESIDENT: No, you're not.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay. Thank you, Mr. President, members, Senator Weihing, you spoke earlier about the university providing some assistance to the local monitoring committee and I think that you are rather supportive of that. Don't you think that this language right here removes them from assisting in any sampling or technical assistance that the monitoring committee will do after the site is selected?

SENATOR WEIHING: Well, it prohibits them from doing drilling but it doesn't prohibit them from making the analysis of the cores that are taken. The cores are there and the logs are there and...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Isn't that...

SENATOR WEIHING: ...they would be available for the analysis of those cores and those logs.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Okay, but that's...

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
