SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I understand that, Senator. What I want to get to...

SENATOR WEIHING: And they can tell what that is.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Well, Senator Weihing, could you answer my specific question of why are you taking out the reference to Section 15?

SENATOR WEIHING: So that there is not duplication and drilling being done by the Division of Conservation and Survey right on the same site, right there, and having that all duplicated.
