Now we're looking for Senator McFarland and Senator Moore.

SENATOR WEIHING: Who have we got missing?

PRESIDENT: We're looking for Senator McFarland and Senator Moore. Senator Weihing, we can't locate them. Shall we go without them? All right. The question is the adoption of the Weihing amendment and a roll call vote has been requested. Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote read. See pages 2389-90 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 14 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. I understand that's the last motion, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I have no further amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the question is the advancement of the bill. While that's debatable you might wish to stick around quite closely so that we may consider advancing the bill. The call is raised. Now...Senator Lindsay, would you like to make the motion and then we will take the speakers.

SENATOR LINDSAY: I move that LB 761 as amended be advanced to E & R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I'm going to be as brief as I can but I was...I was quite taken with that amendment that Senator Lamb offered and I want it clear in the record as it was, I believe, that the ones who brought the amendment are those...I guess it's US Ecology. Is that right, Senator Lamb? Is that who wanted the amendment?

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb, would you respond, please.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, I think...I think it was Environmental Control wanted the clarification but I don't know the exact complete original source if there was another...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The parties to the agreement wanted that amendment.
