SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, to try to facilitate matters, I am going to withdraw that one, because I have a much more meritorious one later.

PRESIDENT: All right, it is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Wesely. Senator Wesely is excused until he arrives, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Do you have another one we can handle until he gets here?

CLERK: The next amendment, Mr. President, is by Senator Schmit.

PRESIDENT: Is he here or is he excused?

CLERK: He has checked in, Mr. President. Mr. President, Senator Schmit would like to pass over his amendments.

PRESIDENT: All right, we will pass over Senator Schmit's amendments.

CLERK: Then I have another amendment by Senator Wesely.

PRESIDENT: We will pass over that one.

CLERK: I have an amendment by Senators Wesely, Morrissey, Smith, and Coordsen. Senator Coordsen would request to pass over that amendment, Mr. President. Senator Haberman would move to amend the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Good, Senator Haberman is here. You have an amendment and we would like to have you take it up, please.

CLERK: Senator, this is, I believe, the Interstate Grain Marketing Compact amendment.

SENATOR HABERMAN: (Mike not on.) ...pass it over...

PRESIDENT: Permanently or just for the time being?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Pardon me?
