attractions in the State of Nebraska, and in that building, they have brochures that tell about Lake McConaughy, and that, yes, Lake McConaughy is the largest tourist attraction in the State of Nebraska, as we have 700,000 people a year go to Lake McConaughy. On one weekend, we will have 70,000 go to Lake McConaughy, but Senator Ashford says these people are willing to drive all the way downtown Omaha, go through Omaha, get on Dodge Street, cut north of Dodge Street, and go into this castle, and when they get inside of this castle, they are going to be told, be sure and go out and see Lake McConaughy. That is smoke, folks. That is smoke. That has nothing to do, in my opinion, with tourism in the State of Nebraska. You go up and down the interstate and we have at every tourist ... at every pit stop and area stop, we have tourism handing out brochures telling them about the State of Nebraska. So then Senator Ashford says, no, these people are going to drive downtown Omaha and go up to this castle and get this literature. Well, I can see it now. Somebody stops in at this big tourism place as they come into Nebraska, and the daddy says to the little boy, well, let's go see the castle, and the little boy says, a castle, a real castle. The dad says, well, according to the brochure. Well, does it is a moat? A moat, no, it doesn't have a moat. Why should it have a moat? Well, a real castle has a moat to keep the bad guys from coming and taking over the castle. No, it doesn't have a moat. Well, does it have a drawbridge. Well, son, why does it have to have a drawbridge? Well, a real castle has a drawbridge so the good guys can run across the drawbridge and then they can pull it up and be safe inside the castle. No, son, this castle does not have a drawbridge. Well, does it have any dungeons? Well, son, what do you have dungeons for? Well, that is where they take the bad people down and they give them a bad time until they tell them what they want. No, son, this castle does not have a dungeon. Well, dad, if it doesn't have a dungeon and it doesn't have a drawbridge and it doesn't have a moat, does it have some big towers on each corner where the ...? What do you need towers for, son? Well, that is where the guards used to stand to be sure that nobody captured the castle. No, son, I am sorry. It doesn't have those. Well, then, he says, how can you call it a castle? Well, gee, I don't know, And the little boy says, well, dad, I don't want to go through downtown Omaha, down Dodge Street, and north of Dodge and go to someplace that isn't a castle. Let's go on out and see Lake McConaughy. That is what this brochure says. We can go boating, and we can go fishing, and we can go swimming, and we can do a lot of things. Let's go on out to
