we will see what the Attorney General's Opinion says, and probably withdraw that other motion. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Haberman-Labedz amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 5 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President, on the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment fails. Do you have anything further, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would move to amend. Senator, I have the amendment found on page 2231 of the Journal in front of me.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, please.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, the Appropriations Committee does have a follow-up amendment dealing with this topic, so I will withdraw this amendment.

PRESIDENT: It is withdrawn. Next, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Hall. Senator, your amendment is on page 2245 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hall, please.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Appropriations Committee also has a follow-up amendment, but I'm not going to withdraw mine. This is an amendment to the amendment that I offered on General File on LB 813 that deals with the textbook loan program, where we inserted the \$150,000 to fund the program. And the amendment that I handed out allows for at the questions of Senator Hannibal and also the Department of Education with regard to implementation of the program, allowing for, as you see in the handout that you're receiving right now, the consultant, the secretary, the development of rules, forms and printing, rent, phone, travel, desks, typewriters, et cetera. It is an amendment that allows for the expense to provide both the staffing and the operation of the program to come out of the \$150,000 that was approved by the body and adopted into LB 813 on General File.
