our state. And so I would urge you to support the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Korshoj.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: Mr. Speaker and members, Senator Coordsen, I don't know if you can answer this question or not. How long a period is job training? Is...does job classifications vary or is it a given amount of time?

SENATOR COORDSEN: I do not know. I would make an assumption, standing here looking at you, that it would vary with the type of job that the training is being provided for but I don't know that.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: No, I...

SENATOR COORDSEN: I don't know an average even.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: Anybody...can anybody answer that? Scott, do you know?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Moore.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: There is no way.

SENATOR MOORE: Well, you don't know.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: It depends on the job...

SENATOR MOORE: I mean, it depends on what it is.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: ...job classification. That's all I had. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Hannibal. Senator Moore next.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Mr. Speaker and members, I am...I am not fervent either way on this issue but it's important, I think, that we maybe put a few things in the record regardless of how this issue is decided. I don't feel uncomfortable with the language we have. I recognize also our success rate hasn't been too great in the last few days. So, on the assumption that we're going to lose this issue, I would like to establish a little legislative intent for the record.
