SENATOR DIERKS: I would just like to see a copy of the amendment, please.

PRESIDENT: Okay, Senator Schmit said he would get you one. We'll move on with the discussion. Senator Morrissey, please.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes, thank you, Mr. President, members. Senator Schmit, could you explain it one more time for me, please.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, what was the question, please?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Just lay it out one more time for me, please, Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Okay. I'll read it for you, Senator.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay.

SENATOR SCHMIT: The amendment conforms the appropriations from the local monitoring committee cash fund, the provisions of LB 761. For fiscal year '89-90 the amendment eliminates \$50,000. The reason is that the local monitoring committee cash fund can only be utilized after a final site is selected. Final site selection will occur after July 1, 1990. Until that time LB 761 provides funding to the local monitoring committee through the site selection cash fund. The amendment also increases the fiscal year '90-91 appropriation for the local monitoring committee cash fund from 50,000 to 100,000. This is done so LB 813 conforms to the provisions of LB 761. LB 761 increases the annual funding to the local monitoring committee to \$100,000. This change is found on page 10, line 3 of LB 761. I'll be glad to also provide you a copy of this, Senator.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: All right, so we're just talking about the final local monitoring committee.

SENATOR SCHMIT: That is right.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Okay, so that should have no effect, basically. Okay, I'm done, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk, do you have a priority motion on this?
