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economic development procedures as possible. The other major concern I have is a great deal of confusion. There's a lot of people for ten years have been working for the Nebraska Business Development Centers and all of a sudden there is a field officer for DED floating around out into that area. If they know that he is working in conjunction with or they could call DED or the NBDC community and identify what their needs and their wants are they have got that energy of those people in that autonomous situation working very closely together. I think we can get just a lot more bounce for our \$235,000 by making sure that these people are in a proximity of one another so that they can cooperate on physical plant, on knowledge, on research, a backlog of information and the like. So with that I offer the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Conway amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Things are going very, very slow, so it may be best if we just have a call of the house.

PRESIDENT: Okay. The question is, shall the house go under call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record please.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Please record your presence. Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Beyer, would you check in please, Senator Labeledz, please check in. Senator Rod Johnson, Senator McFarland, Senator Rogers, Senator Schmit. We are looking for Senator Schmit and Senator McFarland. Now we are looking for Senator Schmit. I understand Senator Schmit is on his way. Senator Schmit is here so the question is, ladies and gentlemen, the adoption of the Conway amendment. Roll call vote has been requested. Please return to your seats so the Clerk can begin. Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken.) 26 ayes, 14 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment. (Vote appears on pages 2421-22 in the Legislative Journal).

PRESIDENT: The Conway amendment is adopted. Do you have
