Then we came back the next day and said, no, that is not what we wanted to do. We want to put it into other areas. Where we are going now is we are saying to the Legislature, we are saying, yes we liked economic development but again Senator Wesely gets up and you can see it coming. Senator Wesely has not been a fan of the Department of Economic Development for years. Anything that we can do to be a thorn in the side, anything that we can do to help cripple, anything that we can do to say, we are going to let you do it but we are going to let you do it in this manner to make it more difficult, we know this is where you think you could be more effective, we know this is where you think it needs to be but by God, we are not going to do that. We are going to put you where we think you need to be regardless of the situation. Senator Wesely gets up and he says, "I support, I support", and he does not support for the right reasons, I'm afraid. I am very disappointed where we have that type of attitude in the Legislature. I know it is late. I know strange things happen. But, ladies and gentlemen, we still have to do the right thing. When the Executive Branch, regardless of who is the governor, Senator Wesely, regardless of who is the governor, when the executive branch says we would like permission to do this for our Department of Economic Development and the Legislature says "Yes, do so." Then it is the responsibility of that department and the executive branch to do the best they know how to find what is the best in their positions of carrying out to the best of their ability the mandate that we asked for them to do in economic development. They have looked at the sites. They have gone through and looked at which was the cheapest and best way to get the most money. You can not convince me, Senator Conway, you can not convince me that the Department of Economic Development no matter what they have done a thousand years ago, Senator Chizek, I know you had problems in your district years ago, regardless of that, no one can convince me that the Department of Economic Development and the Executive Branch would say, "You know, where can we pick a site that we could get the worst product for the most money." You can not convince me that happens. They have gone through, they have looked at the cities that were possible, they have looked at previous cities, they have looked at other cities where they had the economic development branch offices, they have looked at how much the cost is going to be, they even estimated the cost for us people. They came in and said we only need two hundred and thirty six some thousand dollars to do it
