

together resource you have really two choices. You can go out and get people and then take them to the resources or you can be with the resources, where the resources are, then you travel, get the people involved and bring them to the resources that you are working right there with. The Conway amendment does not do that. The way that the body had it decided before does. I would ask the body to reconsider, vote the Conway amendment down and move on. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the motion to reconsider. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President, to reconsider.

PRESIDENT: The situation will be reconsidered. We are now back to the Conway amendment. Senator Conway please.

SENATOR CONWAY: Mr. President, and members, I assume the discussion, if we continue it will follow the same pattern as it has in the past. The question is, what do you want to do with \$235,000? Anything? Or do we leave it at...and it is really a point of discretion. Do we...the discussion is not centered on, in fact, I suspect that no one here has been lobbied specifically with what these field offices and field officers that are going to be out there are even going to do. I've not heard that in any of the discussion at all. The debate started off and we dealt with Senator Haberman's amendment saying well let's put it in a small location, under 5,000. So we identified one of those. Then we went through a period of time and we were talking about let's put them all in small communities because they are supposed to help small communities. Then a few people, I think, saw the light and said, well if we put them in the small communities there aren't going to be any resources there other than that person so, therefore, that doesn't make any sense so let's go ahead and leave the Senator Haberman amendment on which we will have one in one small community, three in three other large communities, still no discussion in terms of specifically what it is these field officers are going to do. Then there were several people who didn't even want field offices and we went through that whole line of debate. What I have offered since we have made a decision within the body to offer \$235,000 to DED to have four field offices, with one of them being in a community under 5,000, just saying, okay if we are going to do that then let's go to the trouble of making sure
