SENATOR CONWAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, like I say, I think people understand the issue, I just would like to see the vote go on the board.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Those in favor of the adoption of the Conway amendment vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record. Senator Conway.

SENATOR CONWAY: Lets call them in and do a roll call.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLEKK: 17 ayes, 3 mays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. The members please return to your seats and check in. Those outside the Chamber, please return. Senator Schmit please. Thank you. Weihing, please check in. Senator Haberman, please. Senator Lynch. The house is under call. Haberman, the house is under call. Senator Haberman, the house is under call. Senator Conway. Shall we proceed, Senator Conway, or would you prefer to wait?

SENATOR CONWAY: We are waiting for Senator Haberman?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Yes.

SENATOR CONWAY: Ah no, there is no need for him. Could I add a point of personal privilege though?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Certainly.

SENATOR CONWAY: Would the Clerk announce what it is we are voting on. There is some confusion relative...we did a reconsideration and his is simply to revote on the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Yes, voting on the Conway amendment, yes. Proceed with the roll call.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. 19 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President. (Vote appears on pages 2422-23 of the Legislative Journal.)
