SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, it is time for the spigot to close. It is time for amendments like this and others that follow to fall quickly into a deathlike trance. I hope that we can call the question shortly, with the Chair's permission and move on.
