

of sending it to DED. And I think also the fear out there is where is this money going to go to. And don't be surprised. You know, a lot of people were concerned, is it going to IBP? Is all the money going to go to one big manufacturer or plant or one area of the state versus taking that money and spreading it around the state and using it to train lots of people and lots of potential job opportunity situations? So I am fearful about what can happen. That fear has been there before and has been well-founded. I hope it's not well-founded again. I hope it's used wisely, but the way to make sure it's used wisely is to send it back to the Labor Department. They've had it, the programs, they have worked those programs, they ought to have the chance to continue in that regard. I would support the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABBOD: Question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Question has been called. I see five hands. Shall debate cease? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Debate ceases. Senator Hall for closing.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Again, the amendment takes the transfer of \$1,000,000 from the Department of Labor Cash Funds and strikes that section out of the appropriations bill that would transfer it to the Job Training Cash Fund under Department of Economic Development. That fund is created in a bill that follows here. That amendment has been filed to strike that. It, again, the discussion has been good but I see it is clearly a substantive change with regard to role and mission and scope of two agencies and I don't think that there has been justification for that. I would urge the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Chizek amendment as explained by Senator Hall. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted?

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I would ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.
