They intend to watch that basket closely but that's what they want to go with, not this approach. Let's entertain them in that by taking this \$6.5 million off the table. Thank you.

We're looking for Senator Barrett, Senator McFarland, Senator Pirsch, Senator Hall, Senator Beck, Senator Schmit, Senator Scofield, Senator Robak. Thank you. Senator Warner, would you record your presence, please. Thanks. Senator Schmit, Senator Goodrich. We're all here now and the question is the adoption of the Landis amendment. Roll call vote has been requested in reverse order. So if you're all in your seats, Mr. Clerk.
