SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members, please check in. Return to your seats for a roll call vote. Members outside the Chamber, please return. The house is under call. Roll call has been requested in reverse order. Senator Kristensen, please. Senator Nelson, would you please record your presence. All present and accounted for. Members, return to your seats. Mr. Clerk, proceed with the roll call in reverse order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken in reverse order. See pages 2479-80 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion fails. The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further on the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I would move to temporarily advance LB 525 to E & R for engrossing.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion on the movement of the bill? Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Members of the Legislature, 525 contains more money than what the budget can hold. I am going to vote against the advancement of 525.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any...I am removing lights now. Please raise your hand. I had a number of lights on the last issue. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I feel the vote that I cast in favor of that motion this morning of Senator Kristensen was a vote cast in error. I was talking to people who were in support of LB 89, and it seems that there was an uncertainty as to exactly what ought to be done. This is one of those issues about which I have personal feelings.
