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able to get that so far.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: And I see senators shaking their heads saying, yeah, I think we can get it out of LB 89 or I think we can get it out of LB 84. You know as well as I do, and I have only been here a year and a half, almost two years, you know as well as I do that all sorts of crazy things happen in the last part of the session that you can't control. And we sit here and we say, yeah, we will be able to get this done, but the Legislature takes a life of its own, my conservative friends, at the last two days, and if you can sit there in your chair and tell me confidently that you will find it, fine. I don't believe you can confidently say that.

PRESIDENT: Time.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I think you are taking a tremendous risk with our state, with our budget, and you know as well as I do, it is not right. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Withem amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.

SENATOR WITHEM: It is obvious it is close and it is going to take every person we have here, so to save time, I would like to ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote in reverse order.

Thank you. The question is, shall the house go PRESIDENT: under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Will you please return to your seats and record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return and record their presence promptly. Please record your presence. We are looking for Senator Baack and Senator Chambers, Senator Rod Johnson and Senator Kristensen. Now we are looking for Senator Chambers and there he is. The question, ladies and gentlemen, is the adoption of the Withem amendment, and, Senator Withem, did you ask for a roll call vote?
