PRESIDENT: Senator Withem, are you close by?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Well, I will ask...Senator Bernard-Stevens, are you close by?

Yes, Senator Bernard-Stevens, would you respond, PRESIDENT: please.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Yes, sir.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Yes, are the figures that the school people are handing out, are they completely bogus or what?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I guess I haven't seen any figures that anyone has handed out.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Oh, that the superintendents were up...yes, okay, well, they just indicate that with LB 84 and everything, that lack of state aid, they are going to have to raise their levies. You know, nonresident tuition is going to sunset in, what, '91, a whole bunch of pressures, they are losing the state aid now, but they feel they are going to have to raise their levies, do you think that is bogus? Are you listening?

PRESIDENT: Senator Bernard-Stevens...Senator Bernard-Stevens, would you respond please?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I am sorry, I was in discussion with the Speaker and missed the question.

SENATOR MORRISSEY: They are basically saying that because of their state aid is going down, in my district anyway, they are losing some state aid, and they are worried about the sunset on nonresident tuition, this was originally for you, Senator Withem, but ...

PRESIDENT: Senator Morrissey, did you want Senator Withem to respond or what?

SENATOR MORRISSEY: Does this count on my time? Yeah, I would like to ask Senator Withem the same question.

SENATOR WITHEM: I'm sorry, Senator Morrissey.
