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school, educational system out at Kearney. So I just want people who know how I have felt all year, that I do not feel that anyone has been trying to get back at me for anything, that anything has been rammed down my throat, no. I am for the study. I want that study to happen. I'd like to be part of it, and I'm...as far as the Kearney State and the univer...coming into the university, we have to wait and see how all these things are going to come together to make it happen and make it happen in the best way. One of the things I'm really...I admire Senator Warner and I think that he...he is good at maneuvering on this floor, I wish I had that political ability that he has. And he had the votes to put 160 into it, good for him, he got it done. I wish, as I say, that I could be that good. I'm very good at waiting, and I can wait through the study and I will vote to be sure, if Senator Withem isn't getting enough votes for the study with the emergency clause, I will vote for it. Thank you very much.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Lamb, please, followed by....

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members, I would just like to tell...just take a minute to explain my dilemma. I don't have a position on whether or not Kearney should be part of the university. I have been voting against this proposal because I agree with the study, I think we need a study of postsecondary education. There is duplication there. I'm not sure that the structure is correct. And I support the study part of the bill. My problem is this, I see putting Kearney in the university in this bill is going to dilute that study. I think with Kearney being part of university, then the pressure is going to be off. We're going to have another study that gathers dust up on the shelf, with the hundreds of other studies we've had in this state on various issues, and nothing is going to happen if Kearney becomes a part of the university and the pressure is taken off, and it just isn't going to work. We're not going to have a substantial study that means anything, in my opinion, if Kearney has already got what they want. And so I don't know how to vote on this bill, I want the study, but I really have problems about putting the Kearney issue right in this bill because I think it's going to make the study go away. And I would give the rest of my time, Mr. Speaker, to Senator Withem.
