

Rule 6, Section 7(b), the two-day rule requirement to permit Final Reading of the budget bills today.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, on behalf of the Speaker, I would offer the motion to suspend the rule to permit the reading of these bills today. And, as he has pointed out in the past a number of times, this is in order to give the Governor over the weekend to give her consideration to the various appropriation items so the bills can be returned to the Legislature if they wish for consideration of vetoes. So I move adoption of the motion by...on behalf of the Speaker.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any discussion? Seeing none, the question is the suspension of the rules, as explained by Senator Warner. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please vote if you would care to vote. Thirty votes necessary to suspend the rules. Thank you. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 32 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on suspension of the rules.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The rules are suspended. Thank you. To the Final Reading. Members, please take your seats. While members are taking their seats and returning to the Chamber, I believe the agenda today is very self-explanatory. The last day bills can be amended and returned, get upstairs and down again so that we can process vetoes next week. We will read a 30-minute...it's a 30 to 45-minute bill at six o'clock this evening in order to give us a chance to get a quick bite to eat, a very short period of time for a dinner break, by the way, very, very short; return to the Final Reading bills that have motions to return following the reading of 285. We have other motions as filed with the Clerk. We will suspend everything at nine o'clock for bills to be processed. We'll return to the floor before we adjourn this evening. While we're waiting for E & R we will continue Final Reading. Proceed with LB 813E, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 813E on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 813, with the emergency clause attached, become law? Those in favor vote
