CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 2554-55 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 0 nays, 3 present and not voting, 3 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 813E passes. LB 814E.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Chambers would move to return the bill for a specific amendment. (The Chambers amendment appears on page 2444 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I was going to make one more run at eliminating that prison construction money but after a meeting with the Governor and discussing the size of this appropriation it was not in her budget, she would not say she's going to veto it. But I told her that my assessment is that she will, that since it never had 25 votes to stay in, I simply couldn't martial 25 votes to take it out, that I'm not going to make this run to pull that from the bill but I am working to sustain the veto which I expect, although she didn't promise it, will be forthcoming. So I want to withdraw that motion.

SPEAKER BARRETT: It is withdrawn. Proceed with the reading of the bill, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read LB 814 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 814, with the emergency clause attached, pass? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the passage of 814E. Have you all voted? Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I would ask for a roll call vote. Can I make an explanation on the vote? Mr. President, I would just ask for a roll call vote.
