SENATOR PIRSCH: Have we also expanded the program from just asbestos to any hazardous waste?

SENATOR WESELY: We have done that. I think we did that last year, I'm not sure, but why we did that was the underground tanks and especially up in Omaha came to light and they decided, gee, we are going to have to spend a lot on that darn thing now too.

SENATOR PIRSCH: But that isn't changed by this amendment?

SENATOR WESELY: I don't think so.

SENATOR PIRSCH: It would still apply to the same?

SENATOR WESELY: Currently already...

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hefner, please. Senator Wesely, would you like to close, please.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. I apologize, this again, this amendment is based on LB 562 as it came out of committee. It helps the schools to allow them the flexibility to, if they so chose, issue bonds to pay for their asbestos and other environmental hazardous mandates that they are facing. It is supported by the schools across the state and I would ask for your adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Wesely amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.
