same amount in proportion in taxes to support education, to see if he really believes in equity and fairness and avoid this all the time up and down, urban-rural kind of conversation. I was going to ask Jacky to name an unmet need in her district, how that would be met, et cetera, but I'm not going to do that at this point in time.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lynch, please. I am going to ask for a little order. (Gavel.)

SENATOR LYNCH: Yeah. No, I...it's a...and all I was going t do, ladies and gentlemen, was to make the point that we have to be consistent in our arguments and I did that on purpose and I use this method to do it because all of you, just think in your own mind's eye now, the questions you asked to justify your opposition to LB 89 and ask yourself, in good conscience and in complete and total honesty, if you would ask those same questions of yourself as it applies to state aid. With that, I respectfully withdraw the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. It is withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have to the bill is by Senators Ashford, Langford, Schimek and Abboud. (Amendment appears on page 2578 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Ashford, will you handle it?
