Omaha, for 18 years, and he opened the school in 1971. I had four daughters that attended Northwest High School so I got to know Jack very well. He also has been active in many civic and community activities in our area of the city. He has done an excellent and dedicated job as both a teacher and administrator in education for lo these many years, 37 years exactly, and I think it is proper and fitting that we honor him in this way. He is going to remain in Omaha with his five children and ten grandchildren, and we look forward to seeing Jack in...still keeping an interest in education and perhaps expanding his community interests as well. To that end, I urge that you adopt this resolution and, also, that a copy of this resolution be presented to Jack Hallstrom at his retirement dinner on June 2nd, 1989. With that, Mr. President, I urge they vote for the resolution.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Hartnett, please, followed by Senator Lynch.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, members of the body, I commend Senator Pirsch for bringing this resolution because I have known Jack Hallstrom for a number of years, and when I went to the community of Bellevue in 1958 as an administrator and worked mainly with the junior high school, I think he was a person I was able to call on and get advice because he was regarded, at that time, as an outstanding junior high administrator. I think he has worked at Northwest High School, has also been recognized as an outstanding high school administrator. So I think this is a nice recognition for an outstanding educator, and I think people like Jack Hallstrom is one of the reasons that we have outstanding schools in Nebraska.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Lynch, please.

SENATOR LYNCH: Yeah, Mr. President and members, some of you may remember what I said about school administrators and boards a few days ago. I just want to let you know this is one administrator I think deserves this honor.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the resolution. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.
