PRESIDENT: Senator Baack, please.

SENATOR BAACK: Yes, Mr. President and colleagues, the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee held a hearing on May 15th for Phyllis Anstine for the Crime Victims Reparations Committee and the committee then voted unanimously, the ones that were at the meeting, to approve Phyllis Anstine for the Crime Victims Reparations Committee and I would encourage the body to adopt their confirmation report.
