We're looking for Senator Robak, Senator Morrissey, Senator Bernard-Stevens. We're looking for Senator Bernard-Stevens and he is here. And the question is, the motion of Senator Hall to override the workers' comp. All those in favor of overriding...now it's a roll call. Are you all in your seats? Please be in your seats so we can hear your response. Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2737 of the Legislative Journal.) 17 ayes, 27 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. The next one, please, Mr. Clerk. The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is by Senator Hall. Senator Hall would move that that portion of LB 813 regarding textbook loan program become law notwithstanding the objections of the Governor.
