Goodrich. Senator Goodrich. Senator Lamb. Call ins have been authorized.

CLERK: Senator Chambers voting yes. Senator Warner voting no. Senator Moore voting no. Senator Hannibal voting no. Senator Beck voting no. Senator Dierks voting yes. Senator Lowell Johnson voting no.

FRESIDENT: Record, Mr. Clerk, please. Senator Withem. A roll call vote has been requested.

SENATOR WITHEM: Check in and a roll call vote, please. I guess we're under call, but I'd like a check in, please.

PRESIDENT: We have just checked in and only one is excused and everybody else is here, Senator Withem. Okay. Senator Schmit, would you take your seat, please. Thank you. Roll call vote. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Took roll call vote. See page 2739 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to override.

PRESIDENT: The motion carried. Next one, Mr. Clerk, please. The call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is by Senator Baack. Senator, this is your motion with respect to the family practice residency at the University of Nebraska Medical Center.

PRESIDENT: Senator Baack, please.

SENATOR BAACK: Yes, Mr. President and colleagues, after Senator Warner's opening remarks about 813 and how we can't put specific items back into the university budget, I'm not exactly sure when this occurred and it seems to me to be quite unusual and it seems to me to put the Governor in a position of being able to line-item and yet we can't go back and put specific programs back in. It seems to put us in a terrible box. But I think that...what I plan to do with this amendment is I plan to carry through with this override veto because I want the language in there and I want the university to do this program whether we put the money in it or not. I think this is an extremely important program for rural Nebraska and I think if this university wants to be the 500-mile campus or whatever they call
