

responsibility it is to provide these facilities. Remember again that the state and federal government draw the rules, write the regs, and the local communities then must live up to them. I had explained to you earlier the unfortunate, unpleasant experience my own hometown, David City, had recently relative to this kind of installation, and I just want to say that it is not easy to comply with rules and regs and statutes that continually come down from the federal and the state government when you're a small community, do not have full-time legal staff and full-time individuals who can understand the many various dicta that come down. So to the extent that we have in the past encouraged this sort of activity, I believe we ought to continue it. I believe when you look at it from the standpoint of the 2 billion plus amount of money we committed this year, this is a minuscule amount of money. Last, but not least, I want to call attention of my urban friends to the fact that I am standing here pleading for money that goes not to rural Nebraska but to the small towns and cities and, yes, indeed, the metropolitan primary class cities of the state also, because I believe we have a responsibility and an obligation to those cities and county...and villages and the primary and metropolitan class cities to help fund those projects which we insisted they carry out. So with that, Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendment. Pardon me, I move for the override.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nelson, please? Your light is on. Did you wish to speak? Or did somebody push your button?

SENATOR NELSON: I think my light got on again. I'm not sure. I'll have to blame Judy standing here, you suppose?
