PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence? Those not in the Chamber, please return so that we may move on. Senator Scofield, would you record your presence? Thank you. Please return to your seats and record your presence. Senator Lamb. Senator Langford. Senator Moore. Senator Wesely?

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, I would be happy to take call-ins at this time.

PRESIDENT: Call-ins are authorized. The question is to reconsider. Looking for Senator Lamb, Senator Moore and Senator Langford. Still looking for Senator Langford, Senator Moore and Senator Lamb. The Sergeant-At-Arms reports that he cannot find Senator Lamb, Senator Langford, or Senator Moore. They found Senator Lamb.

CLERK: Senator Withem changing from yes to no.

PRESIDENT: Roll call vote has been requested. Senator Wesely, shall we wait for Senator Moore and Senator Langford? Senator Wesely, Senator Moore is here. Shall we wait for Senator Langford?

SENATOR WESELY: That's okay.

PRESIDENT: Okay. Okay, a roll call vote has been requested, as I recall in reverse order. Mr. Clerk. And the motion is to reconsider.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on pages 2747-48 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 17 mays, 3 present and not voting, 1 absent and not voting 2 excused and not voting.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries, we will reconsider. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, just real briefly. We talked about it a couple of times now. I appreciate very much your support for the reconsideration. We debated the Certificate of Need law changes that Senator Baack sponsored and Senator Elmer and in the discussion we talked about well how do we handle this health care cost problem.
