SPEAKER EARRETT: Thank you. Senator Langford.

SENATOR LANGFORD: Mr. President, call the question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Question has been called. Five hands? I see them. Shall debate cease? Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 mays to cease debate.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Debate ceases. Senator Hartnett, please.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, simply appreciate the support of the different people who spoke, Senator Chambers, Senator Schmit, and Senator Schellpeper. I think what we are really doing is this may cost us \$98,000 up front, but I think in the long run we are going to save money for the state because we are going to place, the Foster Review Board will be able to serve 300 more children and I think we will help them get into good homes and so for that I ask that you support this override of the Governor's veto.

SFEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is the override of the Governor's veto, Section 9, Foster Care Review Board as explained by Senator Hartnett. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted?

SENATOR HARTNETT: Could I have a call of the house or...or call ins?

SFEAKER BARRETT: Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote as it appears on page 2753 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 7 nays, on the override.

SFEAKER BARRETT: The motion to override succeeds. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is by Senator Weihing with respect to Section 53, University of Nebraska instructional equipment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Weihing, please.

SENATOR WEIHING: Mr. Fresident, members of the Legislature, in 1984 and '85 the Legislature recognized the need for replacement
