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that we should move on at this point in time. Founders Hall is not a new project. It is merely a completion of a project that ran out of money some years ago and never had the third floor put on. It is for nothing more than for classrooms and, with that, I would urge the body to complete this construction project only in the terms of giving it planning money and not money for actual construction. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. You're heard the closing, and the question is the override of the Governor's veto on Founders Hall at Kearney State. All in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: (Began reading record vote.)

SENATOR LANGFORD: I'm sorry. Could we have a call of the house and a roll call vote, please? I couldn't get your attention.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Your light wasn't on, was it?

SENATOR LANGFORD: Oh.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The total vote hasn't been announced so I...the Chair will recognize at this point. The Clerk hadn't gotten to the total.

SENATOR LANGFORD: Thank you very much, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Members, please record your presence. Yeah. Shall the house go under call? Thank you. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 9 nays to go under call.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Please record your presence. Senator Wesely, Senator Lowell Johnson, Senator Landis, Senator Chambers. Senator Labedz, please, the house is under call. Members, take your seats for a roll call vote. Senator Korshoj, would you please check in? Thank you. We're missing only one. Senator Langford, may we proceed with a roll call? Thank you. The question is, again, the override of the veto on Founders Hall at Kearney State. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on page 2759 of the
