SENATOR CROSBY: So the 2 million and the 1 million are just thinking or hoping or...

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Right.

SENATOR CROSBY: Okay. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any other discussion? Senator Scofield, anything further? Thank you. The question is the override of the Governor's veto on Section 39 of LB 814, Trailside Museum. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record. Senator Scofield.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Could we have a check-in and a roll call vote, please?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Please record your presence. Shall the house go under call? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 1 nay, to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Please record your presence. Senator Langford, record your presence. Senator Ashford. We've had a request for a roll call in reverse order. Proceed, Mr. Clerk, on the motion to override.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on pages 2763-64 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is by Senator Schellpeper.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. The project that I am trying to override is the Industrial Arts Building at the State Fairgrounds. Now this is no new project. It's no new building. In fact, the building was built in 1913. It was repaired in 1973, but it's to the point, again, where it needs to be repaired or else tore down. It's a very historic building out there. It covers about 1.4 acres, so you know it's a large building, but we need to do something with the roof.
