The buildings out on the fairgrounds, they're all state owned, state maintained. We do not get any funds from the state to maintain. This is one way that we thought we could repair this large roof rather than have an appropriation every year. I realize that we probably don't have a lot of money. This isn't a lot of money. It's 250,000. It's actually going to cost about 400,000 to repair it. But it's a building that needs to be restored. It's a very important building for the fairgrounds and I would just urge that you override the Governor's veto. Thank you.
