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consistently comes from the Chair and I guess I would ask for a clarification on the point Senator Chambers and I were previously discussing. I think it's fair...maybe not so important for this rule here, but fairly important for debate as we go along during the session.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator, your explanation is consistent with my understanding as well.

SENATOR WITHEM: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lynch, did you wish to close on this motion?

SENATOR LYNCH: No, Mr. Chairman, there has been more than adequate debate.

PRESIDENT: Okay.

SENATOR LYNCH: I would just move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the question is the adoption of rule 2 of the Rules Committee. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. This requires 25 also. Record vote has been requested. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See page 148 of the Legislative Journal.) 31 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Rules Committee amendment number two.

PRESIDENT: Amendment number two passes. Number three.

CLERK: Mr. President...

PRESIDENT: Senator Lynch, please.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. President and members, rule number three, identified on your Rules Committee proposals, simply clarifies what we mean when we say 80th day. Study resolutions may be introduced up to the 80th day. In the past, there has been some confusion as to whether that really means the 79th, or, in fact, it should be the 80th day. If you will look on page 3 for this suggested rule change, you will see we simply added the words "and including". So it would mean that the study resolutions
