amendment. I think it is a clarification that needs to be made. Well, I guess I will speak to the main amendment again later, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Barrett, please.

SENATOR BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. President, and members. Yes, Senator Wesely, it is a good idea that this is brought up today as you suggested a moment ago. Senator Lamb explained the problem that we did run into last year. I think this proposal is good as amended. I support the amendment, Senator Chambers. As long as I am on the floor, let me suggest to you that I like it for a couple of reasons. It does define what we really mean by final action and that it does incorporate, of course, our practice that the committee can change its mind and revote, but it places a limit of eight days. I like the amendment and I hope it passes. I like the proposal then as amended. I hope the body supports it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Lamb, please. Senator Chambers, would you like to close, please?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Just one thing, Mr. Chairman, I don't like all this liking but I still think the amendment is valid and you ought to accept it, even though Senator Lamb and Senator Barrett like it also.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment to Senator Lamb's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Chambers amendment is adopted. Now we are back to the Lamb amendment. Senator Lamb, there are no other lights. Would you like to close, please?

SENATOR LAMB: And I would like to respond to Senator Wesely's comments. It is true that committees adopt amendments in concept and then expect them to be written later, but he suggested the solution to this problem, and that if it is going to extend beyond the eight days, it will only be incumbent upon the committee to pull the bill back into committee and keep it there until the amendments have been written, so that the bill
