Governor to the Legislative Chamber to deliver her State of the State and Budget Message. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is carried. I would appoint Senator Coordsen. Senator Coordsen, I would appoint you chairman of that group since you're the best looking, along with that group Senator Dierks, Senator Pirsch, Senator Weihing and Senator Abboud. Would you folks please gather at the rear of the Legislative Chamber for the purpose of escorting the Governor to the Legislative Chamber. Thank you.

SERGEANT AT ARMS: Mr. President, your committee escorting the Governor of Nebraska.

PRESIDENT: (Gavel.) Before I introduce the Governor, I would like to introduce the First Gentleman of the State of Nebraska, and I asked him how he wanted to be introduced and he said he wanted to be introduced as a full-time taxpayer. So, Mr. Bill Crr. Ladies and gentlemen, the Governor of the State of Nebraska, Kay A. Orr.
