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the vote would be...to reconsider would not be adopted.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Nelson, please, followed by Senators Haberman and Chambers.

SENATOR NELSON: Mr. Speaker, I, too, support the reconsideration. I do appreciate what Senator Lamb has said. And he is true in that respect, I'm very, very hesitant to put anything into statute that does not give us somewhat flexibility. And I also see Governor...excuse me, Senator Warner's position, too. I would hope that the politics is not necessarily the first consideration here. I, too, had bills that were vetoed, the same as Senator Haberman. People just simply could not understand it. It is difficult to explain to the public when they think that...why should we get ourselves in a bind like that. Maybe the message will come out right now that through the consideration and the placing of these bills and the timing of the bills by our own body that would not allow us to get into this bind. I don't...I can recall particularly about two years ago, and I can also recall about four years ago when I came in here some funding for alcohol and drug abuse. As most of you know I raised the tax when I came in here the first year, worked very hard and sponsored that legislation for funding for alcohol, drug abuse and mental health. Two years ago the body was...it was vetoed for additional funding for alcohol, drug purposes. It was vetoed by the Governor. We overrode in one big swoop. That gave us an opportunity to say, again now this happens to be a priority. Maybe we get wiser. But I can also remember when Governor Kerrey also vetoed and the very same situation. And I don't think it's wise for our body to get ourselves locked in where we have no alternative to say yes, yes, yes and then go home and face the news media and the public, what happened down there, and try to explain that away. So it really works both ways. Maybe somehow some understanding. But at this time I will support the reconsideration. But I also have to say that Senator Lamb and Senator Warner have very good points. And I don't necessarily look upon this as the current Governor, because I know it has happened before and it will happen in the future. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Chambers, please. Senator Chambers, further discussion? I'm sorry?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will just close when the time comes.
