SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Lynch, a comment or two on the adoption of the permanent rules as amended.

SENATOR LYNCH: Thank you, Mr. President. The Rules Committee appreciates the attention of the body and I think what was accomplished will hopefully help us manage our important responsibilities a little better. Just want to report to you that there were four other areas of consideration that our committee discussed, which we have no recommendation for you. We may or may not come back to you before the session is over with on issues regarding the appropriations process, Senator Hefner's rule change as it involved the limit of bills that can be introduced in a full and short session, the four day work week issue, and the press on the floor issue. With that, Mr. Chairman, I would move to adopt the permanent rules.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, sir. There are no lights on. The Chair assumes that that is an opening and a closing. Thank you. Those in favor of the adoption of the permanent rules for the
