

are going to appeal from the district court to a higher court, right? Right now the only court we have is the Supreme Court. You want somebody to review what that district court did. You allege some errors. You think that they made a wrong ruling in the case, the judge let in some wrong evidence, or you think the jury was tampered with, or something like that, what you want is another court to make sure that it was correct down below. And so you appeal to another court to examine that case, did we make a mistake? Did the judge do something wrong? Did the jury do something wrong? Did the lawyers do something wrong? And what you really want is somebody who is not associated with the case even to review it and that is what the appellate court will do. Now it doesn't matter if we call them the Supreme Court, these people are not going to be inferior judges. I mean they are going to be qualified judges similar to the members of the Nebraska Supreme Court.

SENATOR HARTNETT: But if I lose in the appellate court, I am done.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: That is your court of last resort.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay, yes. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Lindsay, please.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Question.
