SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I'd refer you to lines 19 through...

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: I'd refer you to lines 19 through 23 in LR 8.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Chambers, your light is on.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, and I'm going to read the language that Senator Kristensen referred to. The Supreme Court shall have jurisdiction in all cases relating to the revenue, civil cases in which the state is a party, mandamus, quo warranto, habeas corpus, election contests involving state officers other than members of the Legislature, and such appellate jurisdiction as may be provided by law. Senator Kristensen, I'd like to ask you a question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Kristensen.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When it refers in line 19 to all cases relating to the revenue, does that mean criminal cases?

SENATOR KRISTENSEN: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When it says civil cases, we know that is not criminal.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is mandamus related to quo warranto?
