

stature of a constitutional amendment, and we know that statutes can be amended. This is one reason why those people who supported amendment, what was it, 300, which one is the corporate farm amendment, 300? Initiative 300, one reason the people who supported that do not want that repealed and put into statute bodily is because the Legislature can change it any way it wants to and repeal it, if it chooses. So when it comes to Initiative 300, we understand that. But when it comes to an appeal from a decision by the Court of Industrial Relations, we are going to say, well, that's not so.

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The Legislature can still give it back, but the Legislature can withhold it, and as a matter of fact, it will have been taken. And I'm not saying it's a litmus test of whether you're for or against labor, Senator Kristensen. The people who are involved with labor will make that determination. And they'll make that determination no matter what you say, no matter what I say. What I can tell them is that Senator Kristensen led the effort to take away your constitutionally guaranteed right to appeal to the Supreme Court. And I'll say, if what I'm saying is not true, let Senator Kristensen call me a liar and show you where that right continues to exist in the Constitution. And, if I'm telling the truth, then you make a determination of whether by doing that he is in support of your rights as laborers, or if he's against you. You make that decision. Lay it out there in front of you. Here's a path to the right, here's a path to the left, you choose which one you want to go. I'm not going to put a gun to somebody's head and say, you must say that I'm right and Senator Kristensen is wrong. It affects your interests, you make that determination. And, Senator Kristensen, if a person perceives something as being real, it is real to that person in its consequences. So, if labor perceives you're taking away their constitutional right to an appeal to the Supreme Court as being against them, so be it,...

SPEAKER BARRETT: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...but you and I are strong enough to deal with that.
