PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the Hall amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Eall's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Hall amendment is adopted. Senator Hall.
CLERK: Mr. Presicient, Senator Hall would move to amend his bill. Senator $I$ believe this is your date change amendment. (Hall amendment appears on page 338 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Hall, please.
SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President, members, now that we have amended LB 240 we have to change the dates that were in the original LB 129. We strike October 1, 1989 and insert January 1, 1991 for the effective date throughout the bill. We also add the language that the proceeds from the surcharge shall be remitted monthly, no later than 30 days after the end of the month in which they are collected. This is so that the industry sends the money to the Public Service Commission so that we can basically pay for the relay system. And then we also add ianguage that specifies the dual-party relay system shall assure prompt and accurate relay of all messages seven days a week, 24 hours a day, including holidays. It's basically a change of the date and clarifying language with regard to the intent of the bill. I would urge the amendment's adoption.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? If not, the question is the adoption of the Hall amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Hall's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The second Hall amendment is adopted. Now we're ready for the advancement, Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I'd be move that LB 240 be advanced to $E \& R$ for engrossing.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. We'll move on to LB 486.
