CLERK: Mr. President, 486, the first order of business are Errollment and Review amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lindsay, please. We didn't hear a word you said. Just a moment, please. Now try us.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Mr. President, can you hear me?

PRESIDENT: Not very well. Now go.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amandments to LB 486.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted. The telephone companies and we are having a problem.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment by Senator Withem to the bill. Senator, this amendment was printed last year, AM0974. Do you want me to read it to you, would that be helpful?

SENATOR WITHEM: That would be delightful, yes.

CLERK: Real helpful? I could tell. (Read Withem amendment as it appears on page 1507 of the Legislative Journal, First Session, 1989.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Withem, please.

SENATOR WITHEM: Okay, 486 deals with some minor changes in the way property transfers from school districts to school districts, freeholder petitions, ESUs and that kind of thing. County treasurers came in and they felt that that there was a need for them to be included within this process also so that amendment is being suggested and it's adding county treasurers to county superintendents and county clerks dealing with transfer of land via freeholder petitions, involves the county treasurers in the line...in the process. They are included in the list of the people up here on page 2 and they were left out of the draft of the bill over here on page 3. This is a very technical amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? If not, the question is the adoption of the Withem amendment. All those in favor vote aye,
