

births. Suppose...and Senator Rod Johnson could help me out on this, but say that they use 12 diapers a day, well, then it would raise approximately \$671,000 a year. If the infant is kept in diapers for two years, you could double that figure. But I want to cooperate with Senator Rod Johnson in trying to find the solution for these problems, so at this time I would like to withdraw this amendment and perhaps add it on at Select File.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. It will be withdrawn at this time.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Wesely.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, please.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. President, and members, I have discussed this amendment with Senator Johnson and Senator Schmit. It deals with the grants going to unlicensed landfills. Rather than offering it at this time, I'm going to also withdraw this amendment and work with Senator Schmit and Senator Johnson on refining it. The concept, I think, is essentially this though, that we want to use this fund in a number of ways. One of those priorities that I think we ought to use it for is taking the unlicensed dumps around the state that are causing a lot of concern and helping them upgrade those dumps to meet standards and be able to be licensed. So I'd like to see that focus put back into the bill. But rather than do that now, on General File, I'll wait to work with Senator Johnson and Senator Schmit to do that on Select. So I'll ask that the amendment be withdrawn at this time.

PRESIDENT: It is withdrawn at this time.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hefner has a second amendment. Withdraw?

PRESIDENT: It will be withdrawn at this time.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rod Johnson, would you like to close on the advancement of the bill?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Yes. First of all, let me thank all the
