PRESIDENT: Thank you. Mr. Clerk, the first amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment I have to the bill was an amendment offered by Senator Chambers. The amendment was filed with me last year, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Has Senator Chambers arrived yet?

CLERK: He is excused until he arrives, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Is anyone prepared to handle Senator Chambers' amendment or should we wait for him? I don't want to pass over this if someone is prepared to handle this for Senator Chambers. We will move on to the next one, in that case. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next two amendments are also by Senator Chambers. He had an amendment to an amendment. Again, these are amendments that were filed last year, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Is anyone prepared to handle Senator Chambers' second and third amendment? We will move on to the fourth one then.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have to the bill is by Senator Schmit. Senator Schmit would move to suspend the rules and vote without further amendment or debate. Senator Schmit is excused until he arrives, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Is anyone prepared to handle Senator Schmit's amendment? Senator Landis? No? We will move on to the fifth one.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is by Senator Smith. Senator, this is a motion that you had filed with me last year. Let me read it to you, Senator. This is the amendment that reads: (Read Smith amendment found on page 445 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Smith, please.
