know how she got into that condition. With that, that is about the only thing that I have to add on that. I might say that love and communication cannot be created by criminal statutes or forcing confidential matters upon the families. And with that, I just, with these very few words, ask for the withdrawal of that amendment because I don't think that it is any wiser than some of the other amendments that are being brought or will be brought. But I cannot see how we can always place all of that burden on that very young girl. I ask for the withdrawal of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have then...sorry, the next amendment I have is by Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator, I have your AM1995 in front of me.

PRESIDENT: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. President. I think this is the final amendment before we get to a suspension motion, and we will probably then move onward. I would like to withdraw that amendment and substitute, if I may, AM2127.

PRESIDENT: Is there any objection to his withdrawing the amendment and substituting with another one? If not, proceed.

CLERK: Senator, just so I am in sync with you, again identify the amendment you are now offering.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: AM2127.

CLERK: All right, thank you. (See AM2127 found on pages 446-49 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Mr. President, I would also like to at this time divide the question, and I don't know if it would be best to talk about the amendment first or do the division. I am going to go ahead and ask for the division of my amendment and division will be as following if I can proceed.

FRESIDENT: Yes.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Okay, thank you. On page 1 of the amendment, I would like to take Section 1, or, excuse me, line 1
