PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Lindsay, you are next, but may I introduce a guest, please, of Senator Moore. Under the south balcony, we have James Friesen of Henderson, Nebraska. James, would you please stand so we may recognize you. Thank you for visiting us today. Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you, Mr. President, and members of the body, I would like to ask Senator Bernard-Stevens a couple of questions.

PRESIDENT: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Lindsay, I would be delighted.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Senator Bernard-Stevens, if we could go to your amendment, and I do this, I guess, for the benefit of the body, I would like to go through that and make sure we have the division correct. Am I correct that line 4 would be one division; line 7...and if I get it wrong, please stop me, line 7 would be the next division?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I think, if I remember correctly, it's on lines 1 through 7 is the first section, Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Okay, thank you. And then lines 8, on page 1, through line 1 on page 2?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: That is correct.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Okay. And then the next one is what?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Then we're going to go to 2(a). So lines 2 through 9.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Okay.
